SECRETARY'S REPORT

Unlike the previous season, 2023/24 almost started on time and was largely uninterrupted throughout the season.

The club introduced a new committee with 50% of the committee being in their roles for less than 2 seasons. New to the committee for 2023/24 were Jim Parry as President, Joel Silver as Treasurer, Geoff Rixon and Matthew Saunders...all making solid contributions.

Following the challenges experienced last season, this year was largely uneventful and the club came together for a successful and largely enjoyable season.

As a committee, we had a number of successes that made the club easier to run and set us up for greater success in the future. These included:

- Transition to PlayHQ from MyCricket
- Better management of the bar
- Transition to a cashless club
- New Defibrillator machines
- Improved communication and social media
- Great social functions including Centenary Ball celebrations and Trivia Night.
- Planning for the introduction of Womens cricket in 2024/25

On field, the season was largely a success. The acquisition of new players including Dave Carman, Fred McMillan, Pat Ryan and others bolstered our chances of making the finals across all senior sides. We were again successful in the 2nds with Zane Macdermid leading the team to glory in one of the most exciting finishes you could imagine. We also won another T20 Premiership under the leadership of Lachy Holmes which went some way to erasing some of the pain from last season's narrow loss. 4 out of 5 remaining senior teams competed in the first week of finals...an outstanding result.



We also fielded 3 Veterans sides with the Vets Div 3 and 4 teams making the semi finals. Tas Tudor led our junior program with great enthusiasm which was rewarded with a Premiership for the U16A's and a first ever Girls Premiership.

The main focus for 2024/25 will be the creation of the inaugural Women's Cricket team. Tas Tudor has taken on the role of Women's Cricket Champion and has been working with stakeholders to get this up and running. We will be seeking a Vice President Women's Cricket to join the Committee to see this initiative through.

My role of Secretary is made so much easier with the support of many others. We are a volunteer run organisation and most people of the committee work full time. There is a huge amount to be done in running a club and a lot of people contribute their own time and I would like to acknowledge the following:

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Club operated at a slight loss of \$325. This represents a fantastic turn-around compared to last season. Revenue increased by 31.2% whilst expenses also grew by 20.1%. GICC is in a very sound financial position with total assets of \$101,589.22 (balance of bank accounts + stock-on-hand).

GICC implemented tighter controls over finances via the implementation of Square to manage inventory. Next season, Xero accounting software will be utilised for even greater oversight. The Club should return to profit next season on the back of forecast decreases in expenditure whilst maintaining revenue.

Key Financial Summary Points -

- Total Revenue of \$191,312.88 increased by 31.2%
- Total Expenses of \$191,637.64 increased by 20.1%
- 2023/24 Operating Loss \$324.76
- 2022/23 Operating Loss \$23,740.37 on total revenue of \$145,806.88 & total expenses of \$159,517.7
- Bank Account Balance \$10,899.66 (as of 30/4/24)
- Term Deposit 1 \$44,125.06
- Term Deposit 2 \$23,009.50
- Stock-on-hand (merchandise) \$23,555
- Sponsorship grew to \$13,825 from \$7292 up 89%
- Total player subscriptions increased from \$51,266 to \$58,509 up 14%
- Additional sources of revenue such as the Centenary Ball, raffle ticket sales, the trivia night & Sportsman's Lunch all contributed to the bottom line
- Expenses increased as a result of hosting the Centenary Ball, a significant spend on merchandise (which is an Asset we can pull on next season), increase spend on balls, umpire fees along with hosting the Centenary Ball & book production

COACH'S REPORT

Dear Gl's,

As we draw the curtains on our centenary year, I feel privileged to have been at the helm of our club during this historic season. The journey we've undertaken together has been nothing short of remarkable, filled with moments that honored our past while paving the way for an exciting future.

As the season unfolded, the historical insights shared in the lead-up to our centenary ball provided invaluable perspective on the rich tapestry of our club's past and the role each of us plays today in adding another chapter to its legacy. We started in May with a small but focused group and ended with the entire playing competing in finals and in many cases players in career best form. Over the course of the season, we saw players achieve career best performances such as batting for 150+ balls, bowling second and third spells as good as their first and being able to ramp up the pressure in the field after 5pm.

Training sessions buzzed with energy, as players of all ages and experience levels came together to share knowledge and engage in spirited contests. The camaraderie fostered during post-training dinner sessions provided a platform for meaningful discussions about cricket and life, further strengthening the bonds within the GICC family.

On the field, the season was marked by resounding success across the board, with all but one of our sides qualifying for finals. While the 1st XI fell short in the semi-final, their performance showcased the strides we've made and the potential for future success. The 2nd XI overcame a slow start to clinch back-to-back premierships in a thrilling grand final win for the ages, while the U/16s displayed a brand of cricket which can withstand the spotlight of grand final cricket and ultimately outlasted strong opposition to collect their own piece of silverware. Our T20 squad completed a faultless campaign, showcasing our ability to also excel under the pressure of finals cricket.

1st XI – Dunstan

After finishing Season 22/23 unfulfilled, the Dunstan group were keen to take the next step in our efforts to achieve the prized Dunstan flag. Our pre-season was exceptional and the belief among the turf squad was there from day 1.

The season started somewhat prematurely, as we ventured to Mont Albert to play on a wicket that looked and felt like a moist mud cake. A lost toss meant that we were unsurprisingly sent in, leading us to post a measly target of 69. Whilst the opposition equally struggled, they managed to pass us 6 down. Not the start we were after, but ultimately began a season which I would grade a B+.

The 1st XI had plenty of consistent periods throughout the year and this was well reflected by our ladder position midway through the season, as we comfortably occupied 2nd spot. Post-Christmas proved to be much more challenging for us as a unit, as we were unable to re-capture the form and momentum that we had built during the first half of the season. However, we stood up when it mattered, clinching a last round victory which meant we would play Mont Albert in a Dunstan Semi-Final. Unfortunately, in all-too-familiar fashion, costly errors throughout our batting innings led a Mont Albert victory which happened to bookend our season for 2023/24.

What was truly pleasing as a captain was the way that some boys were able to consistently deliver when asked to play their role. There were two players that particularly stood out. The first being Lucas Skelton, who knew coming into the season that he had a massive role to play with the ball. Fair to say, Skelts excelled, having his best year as our lead-spinner taking 27 wickets at a comp-leading average of 14.37. What is arguably more impressive was his consistency and ability to bowl more than 20 overs, which he did on four occasions. The second player was Dave Carman. A fresh recruit that started his journey with us in Round 3. From that moment on, DC led from the front, taking on a Herculean load with the ball. In just 10 matches, Dave bowled 130 overs, taking 21 wickets at an average of 16.9. This paired with 204 runs made for an incredible year.

I would like to mention the success of another T20 campaign that was brilliantly led by Lachy Holmes. Winning the Flag are memories that will last a lifetime and it was made even sweeter getting it done over Mont Albert.

We now enter a stage where the squad is ready to go all the way. We have built on our depth, recognised our areas of improvement and I know that we are mentally up for the challenge. We are no longer earning our place in Dunstan Shield. We are well respected competitors. Having a winning mindset, coupled with robust game-day plans is a lethal combination that I look to bringing into season 24/25. My role is to ensure that the 1st XI is in the best position possible to win the Shield come finals in March. I can't wait to get stuck into next year - Go the I's!

2nd XI – C Turf

The season of 2023/24 saw the 2nd XI move up to C-Turf after securing promotion under the leadership of Matt Ciardulli. My goal was to continue to build on the strong foundations Chizz had laid during his time as captain, whilst also adding in my own fresh leadership style and tactics. The chemistry and connection of this group is strong and made my first year as captain an absolute pleasure.

It was a bit of a mixed bag to start to the year, with a close win against Hawthorn in our first game followed by narrowly avoiding an outright defeat to East Doncaster. This left me wondering where exactly we'd fit in the C-Turf hierarchy. But once we got the cattle together in the back half of the year, it was clear that we were going to be competitive at this level.

We were a tad inconsistent with the bat in the first half of the season and often struggled to see out our full allotted overs. Matt Ciardulli (332 runs @33.2) and Luke Gatehouse (275 runs @23.92) were usually the rocks of our innings. Our strength was definitely with the ball, with a plethora of bowling options spearheaded by Cam Proposch (16 wickets @ 13.19) and spin twins Mitch Horn (13 wickets @ 22.37) and Luke Gatehouse (16 wickets @ 16.5). Cam should be looking to push into the 1st XI next season if he can get a good run without any injuries, his pace is as quick as anyone at the club and his ability to cover ground in the field is superb.

At the midway point of the season, we sat inside the top four without feeling as though we'd really played our best cricket. Following a slow re-start post-Christmas and a disappointing performance against Bullen at home in round 12, we were staring down the barrel of having to win our last two games to secure a spot in the finals. With our backs against the wall we managed to put the pieces together and go on a tremendous run of wins, culminating in an incredible grand final victory against Bulleen. Below are some of notable highlights from that period:

- 85-run partnership between young guns Jasper Tudor (75) and Alex Pillay (45), saving our innings from 5/41 to 9/165 against East Malvern Tooronga.

- Cam Proposch 6/22 off 18 overs running through Boronia and securing our place in the finals.

- Dan Cohen's (105) maiden ton in the semi-final against Burwood, a powerful innings that led us to a total of 6/263.

- Mitch Horn bowling a marathon 28 over spell in the grand final finishing with 4/63 and earning himself another man of the match medal.

Another major highlight this season was the continued emergence of our junior talent at senior level. Jasper Tudor, Alex Pillay, Adam Rixon, Evan McVey, Lachie Simpson, Lachie Nicholson and Benji Randabel all filtered through the team at various stages this year. These guys were not just making up the numbers and often had serious impact on the results of games. It's clear the GICC is in safe hands and has an extremely bright future ahead.



Lastly, I'd like to thank the committee for giving me the opportunity to captain this season. To captain a great club like Glen Iris, particularly in the centenary season is an honour that isn't lost on me. I look forward to this groups next challenge of B-Turf next season.

3rd XI – LOC2

The 3rds came into this season full of hope in LOC2 after a premiership in LOC3 saw the side promoted but the side saw an exodus of players from the previous season, with a number of 3rd XI players opting to follow the former 3rd XI captain down the grades.

In the end, it was down to a core group of players, willing to play where selected, that kept the side going and competitive, ultimately making the final four, only to be beaten by the top side, who were a 1st XI outfit.

Week in week out, it was down to Jason Hill, James Taylor, Justin Hendy, Scott Rankin, Jim Parry and myself to keep the 3rds going as the core unit, with great assistance through the year from Harsha Gunaratne, Benji McDonell and the great surprise packet of the season, Will Farley. In all, 37 players took the field for the 3rds this season and thanks go out to all of them.

Often cruelled by unavailability from above and below, it was a great effort by the 3rd XI to make the finals, with the only side we could not get past being the eventual premiers for the grade, Manningham. Our batting really was our strength, led once again by Jason Hill who made 462 runs and James Taylor who made 391 runs including 96 in the semi-final. James' effort was even more impressive considering he missed a number of games due to shoulder surgery, following an injury in the Round 6 against Monash.

Often, our bowling, and at times our fielding, proved to be our Achilles heel as we simply could not defend some meagre batting totals, when the batting line up did not fire; nor could we defend some sizeable totals. Certainly, that is not down to the bowlers themselves; more that they were often asked to do a little too much to bail the side out, and a run before Christmas of some ordinary catching also hurt our outcomes and really let down our bowlers who often toiled away without their deserved rewards.

Huge credit goes out to Justin Hendy for his effort with the ball this year. He was outstanding as the winner of our Bowling Award. It was a pace-off season for us with Justin and Joel Silver spinning us to 31 wickets between them. Thanks also to Scott Rankin in this regard, who I eventually asked too much from and broke him, leading to the premature end to his season.

I did mention Will Farley earlier, but it is worth noting Will's season as a bottom age U16 player, was outstanding. Not only from a bowling and batting perspective but from his attitude. He took bad news maturely and always stressed his aim was to play as high a grade as possible. Such endeavour and desire to play at the highest level possible from a



young player, should not be overlooked and should serve as an example to others who might want their cricket a little easier.

I should also thank Jason Hill and Scott Rankin for stepping into the breach as captain on those occasions I was unavailable myself due to work or commitments up the grades. Certainly, I was not captain of the side at the commencement of the season, so for those two to stand in when required was fantastic.

To conclude, the side will need to bolster its ranks next season with the core group of players well into their 50s, needing to be replaced or supported with younger teammates, to be able to replicate or surpass this seasons' 4th place finish.
